Precipitation, mainly in the form of snow, Temperatures in the air amounted to 49 mm (1.93ins), over 11mm (0.43in) of this falling as rain on the 29th. Snow depth has, fortunately, been low, the maximum new depth being 3 inches on the 15th.

Winds have been lighter than usual averaging 7 mph, the windiest day being the 27th, with gusts of 44 mph and a mean of 16 mph.
