

THE WEATHER OF NOVEMBER 1990

Most of the main climatic elements were near to normal in November, with one or two exceptions. Air temperatures continued to hold up well, particularly under the soil, which is still warm for the time of year.

The month was dull, only two thirds of the usual sunshine being recorded, the 12 sunless days making 40% of the month overcast.

Rainfall is still depressed, the 45mm representing only 66% of the 30-year average, though the number of days with rain was about average.

Fog occurred on 5 days, over twice the usual amount, and ground frost occurred on 12 mornings, also an increase on normal.

However, the month was not unduly windy and we saw no snow, just a little sleet on the 24th.
