

winter

The winter of 1994 was slightly below average ^{the 30-year} in general conditions.

Temperatures were generally up on normal by as much as 0.5°C for the mean daily though the coldest night was some 2.6°C better than expectation at -5.7°C. Continuing the run of mild winters. Both snow and air frost ~~were~~ ^{numbered} less than usual. Air frost was 7 down on normal, but ground frost ~~at~~ ^{numbering} 60 was 10 above expectation.

Snow lay on half the expected days, with the incidence of snow and sleet about expectation. Fog was also only half as prevalent as usual at 5 occurrences.

Sunshine totalled 1470.5 hours. Some 16.8 hrs above the 30 yr mean. The sunniest day provided 7.5 hours on February 21st. In all 28 days were sunless as opposed to the usual 37.

Rainfall was well above average at 239 mm, and fell on 64 days, well up on the customary 49. The wettest days Dec 12 & Feb 25 both gave a fall of 12.2 mm, this being about 60% of expectation.

Yet again, no fall ^{or thunder} was noted, though rain was reported on 1 day. And fog on 5. The max wind gust to 15 km was recorded on Dec 8th.
